Be Prepared:

- Pay attention to your environment.
- Follow all emergency warnings and directions.
- Have a plan of action, trying to figure out “what to do,” or “where to go” when an emergency happens is too late.

Injuries:

- Any injury requiring more than minor attention, please dial 911. After Emergency Personnel are responding, contact Security at 920-605-6754 to inform them of the accident/injury so they may direct the Emergency Responders and provide any additional assistance necessary.
- The Resort First Aid Office is located in the Lifeguard Station at the waterpark. The Lifeguard Station is open May 28th – September 5th, 2011. Hours are Sunday: 9am – 7pm, Monday through Thursday: 11am – 7pm, Friday: 11am – 9pm and Saturday: 9am – 9pm. If you need first aid assistance when the waterpark is closed, please call a Security Guard at 920-605-6754.
- An accident report must be completed for all injuries. These sheets are available in the Lifeguard Office, Security Guard Shack, Reservation Building and the Store.
- Ask any and all witnesses to remain for their statements regarding the accident/injury.

Fires (other than campfires):

- When a fire is identified (other than a campfire) call 911 immediately. Provide the fire identification number W6940. After calling 911, contact Security at 920-605-6754 so they may direct the Emergency Responders and provide any additional assistance necessary.

**Severe Weather:
Watches & Warning Definitions:**

- **Thunderstorms:** Most common during the spring, summer, and fall seasons. Severe thunderstorms may produce heavy rain, flash flooding, severe winds, hail, and lightning. Rainfall is the most recognizable feature of thunderstorms, and a significant flash flooding hazard exists due to thunderstorms.

Thunderstorm Watch	Precautionary alert when conditions are favorable for the development of thunderstorms in the specific area.
Thunderstorm Warning	A severe thunderstorm warning is issued when conditions indicate a strong thunderstorm is producing dangerously large hail or high winds, capable of causing significant damage.

- **Tornadoes:** A violent windstorm characterized by a twisting, funnel-shaped cloud. It is spawned by a thunderstorm and produced when cool air overrides a layer of warm air, forcing the warm air to rise rapidly. The damage from a tornado is a result of the high wind velocity and wind-blown debris.

Tornado Watch	Precautionary alert when conditions are favorable for the development of tornados in the specific area.
Tornado Warning	Tornado has actually been sighted by spotters or indicated on radar and is occurring or imminent in the warning area. This requires the immediate notification of all personnel to safe shelter until the tornado has passed or dissipates.

Severe Weather/Shelter Instructions:

- ***Designated Safe Shelter*** is the basement level of the Bar & Restaurant Building.
- Management will be responsible for monitoring severe weather and announcing all “watches and warnings”.
- The siren will sound in the event of a tornado warning. At the sound of the siren, be prepared to take shelter in the designated safe shelter area or in a low lying area.
- Contact Security at 920-605-6754 should anyone need assistance seeking shelter.
